

Prevention Apprentice Application

This entry level pre-certification is intended for those entering the field of prevention in academic, employment or volunteer situations. This certification is issued for a two-year period and is re-certifiable for one additional two-year period. After that, you must upgrade to the CP or ICPS credential to remain actively certified.

Qualifications: Candidates for PA certification must:

- Live or work in Georgia at least 51% of the time;
- Complete the four mandatory PCCG core courses within 2 years of the application and have certificates of attendance for each course;
- Have 1 letter of recommendation;
- Complete the PA application and pay the application fee.

Steps to the Prevention Apprentice Certification:

- **1.** Visit the PCCG website, <u>www.pccga.org</u> and download the Application Manual and Prevention Apprentice Application or request them by email, <u>pccginfo@gmail.com</u>.
- 2. Take the four mandatory core courses:
 - Fundamentals of Prevention* (12 hours)
 - Cultural Competency* (6 hours)
 - Communications for the Prevention Professional (6 hours)
 - Prevention Ethics** (6 hours)
- **3.** Request a letter of recommendation from a supervisor, instructor or volunteer coordinator to be sent to PCCG.
- **4.** Complete the PA Application, attach certificates of attendance for each of the core courses and make a check or money order payable to PCCG for the application fee or request to pay the fee through PCCG's PayPal account.

*The **Substance Abuse Prevention Skills Training (SAPST)** can be used in lieu of the Fundamentals and Cultural Competence core courses if it was taken within 2 years of the application and you have a certificate of attendance.

The 6-hour moderated online course **Ethics in Prevention offered by Prevention Solutions (<u>preventionsolutions@edc.org</u>) will be accepted in lieu of the ethics core course if it was taken within 2 years of the application and you have a certificate of attendance.
